Level 2 Nursery Assistant Job Description

Job Purpose:

In liaison with the Headteacher:

- To be involved in the implementation of relevant school policies
- To work closely with the Family and Community support team and local schools to ensure consistency and continuity of care, education and play opportunities for the children
- To observe and record individual children's development
- To communicate effectively with parents and carers of the children within the setting
- To attend team meetings and inset days as required
- To ensure at all times compliance with OFSTED standards
- To be aware of child protection policy and procedures
- To respect the confidentiality of information received
- To have a commitment to personal and professional development
- To prepare for and receive supervision
- To undertake such other duties as may reasonably be required by the Headteacher such as changing nappies.
